Do you see where the Lord has brought you to as refuge or do you see where the Lord has brought you as a place where your wives and your children are a prey? (Psalms 91:2) (Num 14:2-3)

Do you see empty vessels without hope or do you see vessels that will be filled full of oil? (2 Kings 4:1-7) (Matthew 25:1-13)

Do you see the Rivers in Damascus as much better than all the waters of Israel or do you see the River of Jordan and obedience to God as more important? (2 Kings 5:1-14) (Mark 12:32-34)

Do you see as the servant of Elisha thither horses, and chariots, and a great host: and they came by night, and compassed the city about or do you see as Elisha who said LORD, I pray thee, open his eyes, that he may see. And the LORD opened the eyes of the young man; and he saw: and, behold, the mountain was full of horses and chariots of fire round about Elisha? And when they came down to him, Elisha prayed unto the LORD, and said, Smite this people, I pray thee, with blindness. And he smote them with blindness according to the word of Elisha.
