Num 16:1-50

16:1 Now Korah, the son of Izhar, the son of Kohath, the son of Levi, and Dathan and Abiram, the sons of Eliab, and On, the son of Peleth, sons of Reuben, took men:

2 And they rose up before Moses, with certain of the children of Israel, <u>two</u> <u>hundred and fifty princes of the assembly</u>, famous in the congregation, <u>men of</u> <u>renown</u>:

3 And they gathered themselves together <u>against Moses and against Aaron</u>, and said unto them, <u>Ye take too much upon you</u>, seeing all the congregation are holy, every one of them, and the LORD is among them: <u>wherefore then lift ye up</u> <u>yourselves above the congregation of the LORD</u>?

4 And when Moses heard it, he fell upon his face:

We see that Moses knows that Korah has sinned in the sight of the Lord and has fell down upon the ground.

5 And he spake unto Korah and unto all his company, saying, Even to morrow <u>the</u> <u>LORD will show who are his</u>, and <u>who is holy</u>; and will cause him to come near unto him: even him <u>whom he hath chosen will he cause to come near unto him</u>.

6 This do; Take you censers, Korah, and all his company;

7 And <u>put fire therein</u>, and <u>put incense in them before the LORD to morrow</u>: and it shall be that the man whom the LORD doth choose, <u>he shall be holy</u>: ye take too much upon you, ye sons of Levi.

8 And Moses said unto Korah, <u>Hear</u>, I pray you, <u>ye sons of Levi</u>:

9 <u>Seemeth it but a small thing unto you</u>, that the God of Israel hath separated you from the congregation of Israel, to bring you near to himself to do the service of the tabernacle of the LORD, and to stand before the congregation to minister unto them?

10 And he hath brought thee near to him, and all thy brethren the sons of Levi with thee: <u>and seek ye the priesthood also</u>?

11 For which cause both thou and all thy company are gathered together against the LORD: and what is Aaron, that ye murmur against him?

12 And Moses sent to call Dathan and Abiram, the sons of Eliab: which said, We will not come up:

13 Is it a small thing that thou hast brought us up out of a land that floweth with milk and honey, to kill us in the wilderness, except thou make thyself altogether a prince over us?

14 Moreover thou hast not brought us into a land that floweth with milk and honey, or given us inheritance of fields and vineyards: wilt thou put out the eyes of these men? we will not come up.

Now these men have told Moses in their complaining that you have not brought us to the Land of Milk and Honey and it was a small thing that you took us out of Egypt.

15 And Moses was very wroth, and said unto the LORD, Respect not thou their offering: I have not taken one ass from them, neither have I hurt one of them.
16 And Moses said unto Korah, Be thou and all thy company before the LORD, thou, and they, and Aaron, to morrow:

17 And <u>take every man his censer</u>, and <u>put incense in them</u>, and <u>bring ye before</u> <u>the LORD every man his censer</u>, two hundred and fifty censers; thou also, and Aaron, each of you his censer.

18 And they took every man his censer, and put fire in them, and laid incense thereon, and stood in the door of the tabernacle of the congregation with Moses and Aaron.

19 And <u>Korah gathered all the congregation against them unto the door of the</u> <u>tabernacle of the congregation</u>: and the **glory of the LORD appeared unto all the congregation**.

20 And the LORD spake unto Moses and unto Aaron, saying,

21 <u>Separate yourselves from among this congregation</u>, that <u>I may consume them</u> in a moment.

22 And they fell upon their faces, and said, O God, the God of the spirits of all flesh, <u>shall one man sin</u>, and wilt thou be wroth with all the congregation?

23 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

24 <u>Speak unto the congregation</u>, saying, Get you up from about the tabernacle of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram.

25 And Moses rose up and went unto Dathan and Abiram; and the elders of Israel followed him.

26 And he spake unto the congregation, saying, <u>Depart</u>, I pray you, <u>from the tents</u> of these wicked men, and <u>touch nothing of theirs</u>, <u>lest ye be consumed in all their</u> <u>sins</u>.

27 So they gat up from the tabernacle of Korah, Dathan, and Abiram, on every side: and Dathan and Abiram came out, and stood in the door of their tents, and their wives, and their sons, and their little children.

28 And Moses said, <u>Hereby ye shall know that the LORD hath sent me to do all</u> these works; for <u>I have not done them of mine own mind</u>.

29 If these men die the common death of all men, or if they be visited after the visitation of all men; then the LORD hath not sent me.

30 But if the LORD make a new thing, and <u>the earth open her mouth</u>, and <u>swallow</u> them up, with <u>all that appertain unto them</u>, and <u>they go down quick into the pit</u>; then ye shall understand that these men have provoked the LORD.

31 And it came to pass, <u>as he had made an end of speaking all these words</u>, that <u>the ground clave as under that was under them</u>:

32 And the <u>earth opened her mouth</u>, and <u>swallowed them up</u>, and <u>their houses</u>, and <u>all the men that appertained unto Korah</u>, and all their goods.

33 They, and all that appertained to them, <u>went down alive into the pit</u>, and the <u>earth closed upon them</u>: and <u>they perished from among the congregation</u>.

34 And all Israel that were round about them fled at the cry of them: for they said, <u>Lest the earth swallow us up also</u>.

35 And there came <u>out a fire from the LORD</u>, and <u>consumed the two hundred and</u> <u>fifty men that offered incense</u>.

Again we see the Law of Sin and Death as the Lord allowed the Earth to open her mouth and swallow these men who had come against Moses and the Lord.

36 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

37 Speak unto <u>Eleazar the son of Aaron the priest</u>, that he take up the censers out of the burning, and scatter thou the fire yonder; <u>for they are hallowed</u>.

38 The censers of <u>these sinners</u> against their own souls, <u>let them make them broad</u> <u>plates for a covering of the altar</u>: for they offered them before the LORD, <u>therefore</u> <u>they are hallowed</u>: and <u>they shall be a sign unto the children of Israel</u>.

39 And Eleazar the priest took the brazen censers, wherewith they that were burnt had offered; and they were made broad plates for a covering of the altar:

40 To be a memorial unto the children of Israel, that no stranger, <u>which is not of</u> <u>the seed of Aaron</u>, come near <u>to offer incense before the LORD</u>; that he be not as Korah, and as his company: as the LORD said to him by the hand of Moses. 41 But on the morrow all the congregation of the children of Israel <u>murmured</u> against Moses and against Aaron, saying, Ye have killed the people of the LORD.

Again we see the people of Israel never learned from this experience and continued to complain and accused Moses and his brother Aaron of killing the men of the Lord.

42 And it came to pass, when the <u>congregation was gathered against Moses and</u> <u>against Aaron</u>, that they looked toward the tabernacle of the congregation: and, behold, <u>the cloud covered it</u>, and the <u>glory of the LORD appeared</u>.

43 And Moses and Aaron came before the tabernacle of the congregation.

44 And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying,

45 Get you up from among this congregation, that <u>I may consume them as in a</u> <u>moment</u>. And they fell upon their faces.

46 And Moses said unto Aaron, <u>Take a censer</u>, and <u>put fire therein from off the</u> <u>altar</u>, and <u>put on incense</u>, and <u>go quickly unto the congregation</u>, and <u>make an</u> <u>atonement for them</u>: for there is <u>wrath gone out from the LORD</u>; the <u>plague is</u> <u>begun</u>.

47 And Aaron took as Moses commanded, and ran into the midst of the congregation; and, behold, <u>the plague was begun among the people: and he put on incense, and made an atonement for the people</u>.

48 And he stood between the <u>dead and the living</u>; and <u>the plague was stayed</u>.
49 Now <u>they that died in the plague were fourteen thousand and seven hundred</u>, beside them that died about the matter of Korah.

50 And Aaron returned unto Moses unto the door of the tabernacle of the congregation: and the plague was stayed.

This time, because of the Law of Sin and Death, the Lord killed fourteen thousand seven hundred men, on top of those of Korah and those that stood with him.

This brings us back to the promise of the seed of Abraham. The seed of Abraham was the birth of Jesus Christ. The sacrificial Lamb that came that we may get remission of sins, versus only receiving a covering for our sins.

Through this atonement, Jesus made for us a reconciliation between mankind and God, at the same time, He took back the keys of death and hell from Satan, who had the power over us.

Heb 2:14-17

14 Forasmuch then as the children are partakers of flesh and blood, he (Jesus) also himself likewise took part of the same; that <u>through death he might destroy him</u> that had the power of death, that is, <u>the devil</u>;

15 And <u>deliver them who through fear of death were all their lifetime subject to</u> <u>bondage</u>.

16 For verily he took not on him the nature of angels; but <u>he took on him the seed</u> <u>of Abraham</u>.

17 Wherefore in all things it behoved him to be made like unto his brethren, that <u>he might be a merciful and faithful high priest in things pertaining to God</u>, to <u>make</u> reconciliation for the sins of the people.

Col 1:20-23

20 And, <u>having made peace through the blood of his cross</u>, by him <u>to reconcile all</u> <u>things unto himself</u>; by him, I say, whether they be things in earth, or things in heaven.

21 And you, that were <u>sometime alienated and enemies in your mind by wicked</u> works, yet <u>now hath he reconciled</u>

22 In the <u>body of his flesh through death</u>, to present you **holy** and **unblameable** and **unreproveable** in his sight:

23 <u>If ye continue in the faith grounded and settled</u>, and <u>be not moved away from</u> <u>the hope of the gospel</u>, which ye have heard, and which was preached to every creature which is under heaven; whereof I Paul am made a minister;

Here we have learned that by the death of Jesus Christ through the blood He shed on the cross of Calvary, that He reconciled us unto God. To present us Holy, unblameable, and unreproveable in his sight.

Psalms 16:8-11

8 I have set the LORD always before me: because he is at my right hand, <u>I shall</u> <u>not be moved</u>.

9 Therefore my heart is glad, and my glory rejoiceth: my flesh also shall <u>rest in hope</u>.

10 For thou wilt not leave my soul in hell; neither wilt thou suffer thine Holy One to see corruption.

11 Thou wilt <u>show me the path of life</u>: in thy presence is fulness of joy; at thy right hand there are pleasures for evermore.

Here we see that David in prophecy tells us that Jesus Christ's soul will not remain in hell, and God will not allow his Holy One, to see corruption. It is important to understand that Jesus Chris had power over Death and of Hell, and that he descended into the bowels of the Earth into Hell, and preached to those that were imprisoned there. It also is important to understand that at this time, Hell had two different areas, that was separated by a great gulf. The one side contained the wicked and the unrighteous soul, whereas the other side contained the Bosom of Abraham. To better understand this, let's read about it in...

Luke 16:19-31

19 There was a certain rich man, which was clothed in purple and fine linen, and fared sumptuously every day:

20 And there was a certain beggar named Lazarus, which was laid at his gate, full of sores,

21 And desiring to be fed with the crumbs which fell from the rich man's table: moreover the dogs came and licked his sores.

22 And it came to pass, that <u>the beggar died</u>, and was <u>carried by the angels into</u> <u>Abraham's bosom</u>: the rich man also died, and was buried;

23 And in <u>hell he lift up his eyes</u>, <u>being in torments</u>, and seeth Abraham afar off, and Lazarus in his bosom.

24 And he cried and said, Father Abraham, have mercy on me, and send Lazarus, that he may dip the tip of his finger in water, and cool my tongue; <u>for I am</u> tormented in this flame.

25 But Abraham said, Son, remember that thou in thy lifetime receivedst thy good things, and likewise Lazarus evil things: but now he is comforted, and thou art tormented.

26 And beside all this, between us and you there <u>is a great gulf fixed</u>: so that they which would pass from hence to you cannot; neither can they pass to us, that would come from thence.

27 Then he said, I pray thee therefore, father, that thou wouldest send him to my father's house:

28 For I have five brethren; that he may testify unto them, lest they also come into this place of torment.

29 Abraham saith unto him, They have Moses and the prophets; let them hear them.

30 And he said, Nay, father Abraham: but if one went unto them from the dead, they will repent.

31 And he said unto him, <u>If they hear not Moses and the prophets, neither will</u> they be persuaded, though one rose from the dead.

This also should tell us another thing concerning people who say, well I will not remember those who did not make it to heaven, because then I would be sad. This is not true. Here you see that both the rich man and Abraham had their right minds. Abraham was able to see the rich man in the flames of his torment, and was able to speak to him. Abraham was not screaming in crying in agony. He spoke and told the rich man he was impossible for him to come over to where he was, but also reminded him that because he received the good things in life, that he was now tormented, whereas Lazarus received evil in his life on Earth, but now is comforted in this life.

Before Jesus Christ died on the Cross of Calvary that scribes and the Pharisees asked Jesus to give them a sign, so that they would know he was the Son of God. He tells them that the Son of man will be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth.

Matthew 12:38-42

38 Then certain of the scribes and of the Pharisees answered, saying, Master, we would see a sign from thee.

39 But he answered and said unto them, An <u>evil and adulterous generation seeketh</u> <u>after a sign</u>; and <u>there shall no sign be given to it</u>, but the sign of the prophet Jonas: 40 For as Jonas was three days and three nights in the whale's belly; so <u>shall the</u> <u>Son of man be three days and three nights in the heart of the earth</u>.

41 The <u>men of Nineveh shall rise in judgment with this generation</u>, and shall <u>condemn it</u>: because they repented at the preaching of Jonas; and, behold, <u>a greater</u> than Jonas is here.

42 The <u>queen of the south shall rise up in the judgment with this generation, and</u> <u>shall condemn it</u>: for she came from the uttermost parts of the earth <u>to hear the</u> <u>wisdom of Solomon</u>; and, behold, a <u>greater than Solomon is here</u>.

We learn from our next portion of reading that the Bosom of Abraham was also called Paradise. We find this out as Jesus is hanging on the Cross of Calvary.

Luke 23:34-43

34 Then said Jesus, Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do. And they parted his raiment, and cast lots.

35 And the people stood beholding. And the rulers also with them <u>derided him</u>, saying, He saved others; let him save himself, if he be Christ, the chosen of God.

36 And the soldiers also mocked him, coming to him, and offering him vinegar,

37 And saying, If thou be the king of the Jews, save thyself.

38 And a superscription also was written over him in letters of Greek, and Latin, and Hebrew, **THIS IS THE KING OF THE JEWS**.

39 And one of the malefactors which were hanged <u>railed on him</u>, saying, If thou be Christ, <u>save thyself and us</u>.

40 But the other answering rebuked him, saying, Dost not thou fear God, seeing thou art in the same condemnation?

41 And we indeed justly; for we receive the <u>due reward of our deeds</u>: but this man <u>hath done nothing amiss</u>.

42 And he said unto Jesus, **Lord**, <u>remember me</u> when thou <u>comest into thy</u> <u>kingdom</u>.

43 And Jesus said unto him, Verily I say unto thee, <u>To day shalt thou be with me</u> in paradise.

We learn In I Peter chapter three that while Jesus was in paradise he preached unto the spirits in prison and tells us that even as Noah's family was saved by water, we like unto it our also saved by the baptism. I Peter 3:18-21

18 For Christ also hath <u>once suffered for sins</u>, the just for the unjust, that he might bring us to God, being <u>put to death in the flesh</u>, but quickened by the Spirit:

19 By which also he went and preached unto the spirits in prison;

20 Which sometime were disobedient, when once the longsuffering of God waited in the days of Noah, while the ark was a preparing, wherein few, that is, eight souls were <u>saved by water</u>.

21 The like figure whereunto <u>even baptism doth also now save us</u> (not the putting away of the filth of the flesh, but the answer of a good conscience toward God,) by the <u>resurrection of Jesus Christ</u>:

In these scriptures sadly many people get the idea that the only purpose in baptism is for a good conscience toward God. This is not true.

Romans 6:3-14

3 <u>Know ye not</u>, that so many of us <u>as were baptized into Jesus Christ were baptized into his death</u>?

4 Therefore we are buried with him by baptism into death: that like as Christ was raised up from the dead by the glory of the Father, even so we also should walk in newness of life.

5 For if we have been planted together <u>in the likeness of his death</u>, we shall be also <u>in the likeness of his resurrection</u>:

6 **Knowing this**, that our <u>old man is crucified with him</u>, that <u>the body of sin might</u> <u>be destroyed</u>, that <u>henceforth we should not serve sin</u>.

7 For he that is dead is freed from sin.

8 Now if we be <u>dead with Christ</u>, we believe that <u>we shall also live with him</u>:

9 <u>Knowing</u> that <u>Christ being raised from the dead dieth no more; death hath no more dominion over him</u>.

10 For in that he died, <u>he died unto sin once</u>: but in that he liveth, <u>he liveth unto</u> <u>God</u>.

11 Likewise <u>reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin</u>, but <u>alive unto</u> <u>God through Jesus Christ our Lord</u>.

12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.

13 Neither <u>yield ye your members as instruments of unrighteousness unto sin</u>: but <u>yield yourselves unto God</u>, as <u>those that are alive from the dead</u>, and <u>your members</u> <u>as instruments of righteousness unto God</u>.

14 For <u>sin shall not have dominion over you</u>: for <u>ye are not under the law</u>, but <u>under grace</u>.

With this knowledge of the importance of Baptism and to hear for yourselves that what David had said in the Psalms concerning Jesus being in the bowels of the Earth and that His soul would not be left in hell, I'd like to call our attention to the book of....

Acts 2:1-8

1 And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were <u>all with one accord in</u> <u>one place</u>.

2 And suddenly there came a <u>sound from heaven</u> as of a rushing mighty wind, and <u>it filled all the house where they were sitting</u>.

3 And there <u>appeared unto them cloven tongues</u> like as of fire, and <u>it sat upon each</u> <u>of them</u>.

4 And they were <u>all filled with the Holy Ghost</u>, and <u>began to speak with other</u> tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance.

5 And there were dwelling at Jerusalem Jews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven.

6 Now when this was noised abroad, the <u>multitude came together</u>, and were <u>confounded</u>, because that every man <u>heard them speak in his own language</u>.

7 And they were <u>all amazed and marvelled</u>, saying one to another, Behold, <u>are not</u> <u>all these which speak Galilaeans</u>?

8 And how hear we every man in our own tongue, wherein we were born?

Continuing at verse 12

Acts 2:12-18

12 And they were <u>all amazed</u>, and <u>were in doubt</u>, saying one to another, <u>What</u> <u>meaneth this</u>?

13 Others mocking said, These men are full of new wine.

14 But **Peter**, standing up <u>with the eleven</u>, <u>lifted up his voice</u>, and said unto them, Ye men of Judaea, and all ye that dwell at Jerusalem, be this known unto you, and <u>hearken to my words</u>:

15 For these <u>are not drunken</u>, as ye suppose, seeing it is but the third hour of the day.

16 But this is that which was spoken by the prophet Joel;

17 And it shall come to pass in the last days, saith God, <u>I will pour out of my</u> <u>Spirit upon all flesh</u>: and your sons and your daughters <u>shall prophesy</u>, and your young men <u>shall see visions</u>, and your old men <u>shall dream dreams</u>:

18 And on my servants and on my handmaidens <u>I will pour out in those days of</u> my Spirit; and they shall prophesy:

Continuing at verse 22

Acts 2:22-33

22 Ye men of Israel, <u>hear these words</u>; Jesus of Nazareth, a man approved of God among you by miracles and wonders and signs, which God did by him in the midst of you, as ye yourselves also know:

23 Him, being delivered by the determinate counsel and foreknowledge of God, <u>ye</u> <u>have taken</u>, and <u>by wicked hands have crucified and slain</u>:

24 Whom God hath raised up, having <u>loosed the pains of death</u>: because <u>it was not</u> <u>possible that he should be holden of it.</u>

25 For <u>David speaketh concerning him</u>, I foresaw the Lord always before my face, for he is on my right hand, that I should not be moved:

26 Therefore did my heart rejoice, and my tongue was glad; moreover also my flesh shall rest in hope:

27 Because <u>thou wilt not leave my soul in hell</u>, neither <u>wilt thou suffer thine Holy</u> <u>One to see corruption</u>.

28 Thou hast made known to me the ways of life; thou shalt make me full of joy with thy countenance.

29 Men and brethren, <u>let me freely speak unto you of the patriarch David</u>, that he is both dead and buried, and his sepulchre is with us unto this day.

30 Therefore being a prophet, and knowing that God had sworn with an oath to him, that of the fruit of his loins, according to the flesh, <u>he would raise up Christ to sit on his throne;</u>

31 He seeing this before <u>spake of the resurrection of Christ</u>, that <u>his soul was not</u> <u>left in hell</u>, neither <u>his flesh did see corruption</u>.

32 This Jesus hath God raised up, whereof we all are witnesses.

33 Therefore being by the right hand of God <u>exalted</u>, and having received of the Father the <u>promise of the Holy Ghost</u>, he hath shed forth this, which <u>ye now see</u> and hear.

Continuing at verse 37

Acts 2:37-39

37 Now when they heard this, they were pricked in their heart, and said unto Peter and to the rest of the apostles, Men and brethren, what shall we do?

38 Then Peter said unto them, <u>Repent</u>, and <u>be baptized</u> every one of you in the <u>name of Jesus Christ</u> for the **remission of sins**, and <u>ye shall receive the gift of the</u> Holy Ghost.

39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

This fulfilled Matt 16:18-19 When Jesus spoke to Peter saying.

18 And I say also unto thee, That thou art Peter, and <u>upon this rock I will build my</u> church; and <u>the gates of hell shall not prevail against it.</u>

19 And I will give unto thee <u>the keys of the kingdom of heaven</u>: and whatsoever <u>thou shalt bind on earth shall be bound in heaven</u>: and whatsoever <u>thou shalt loose</u> <u>on earth shall be loosed in heaven</u>.

It is very important to understand that Peter was given the keys to the kingdom of heaven. And when the men asked what they must be do, Peter told them to 1) Repent, 2) and be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ. He then explained that those two steps of Repentance and Baptism was for the remission of sin. And that they would 3) receive the gift of the Holy Ghost.

This also fulfilled John 3:1-7 when Jesus Christ was talking with Nicodemus

John 3:1-7

1 There was a man of the Pharisees, named Nicodemus, a ruler of the Jews:

2 The same came to Jesus by night, and said unto him, Rabbi, <u>we know that thou</u> <u>art a teacher come from God</u>: for <u>no man can do these miracles that thou doest</u>, <u>except God be with him</u>.

3 Jesus answered and said unto him, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be **born again**, <u>he cannot see the kingdom of God</u>.

4 Nicodemus saith unto him, How can a man be born when he is old? can he enter the second time into his mother's womb, and be born?

5 Jesus answered, Verily, verily, I say unto thee, Except a man be born of **water** and of the **Spirit**, <u>he cannot enter into the kingdom of God</u>.

6 That which is born of the flesh is flesh; and <u>that which is born of the Spirit is</u> <u>spirit</u>.

7 Marvel not that I said unto thee, Ye must be born again.

Notice Jesus told him two things that must be done. Must be born of water, and must be born of Spirit. The water being the baptism in Jesus name, and the Spirit being, receiving the Holy Ghost with evidence of speaking in tongues as the men did in the book of Acts. If you have been told that was something that happened only back in that day, listen again to verse 39 of Acts chapter 2.

Acts 2:39

39 For the promise is unto you, and to your children, and to all that are afar off, even as many as the Lord our God shall call.

This brings us to where Jesus Christ tells us that he has the keys of hell and of death.

Revelation 1:17-18
17 And when I saw him, <u>I fell at his feet as dead</u>. And he laid his right hand upon me, saying unto me, Fear not; I am the first and the last:
18 I am he that liveth, and was dead; and, behold, I am alive for evermore, Amen; and have the keys of hell and of death.

This was the fulfilment of Genesis chapter 3 back at the beginning of our lesson, concerning judgement against Satan.

## Gen3:14-15

14 And the LORD God said unto the serpent, Because thou hast done this, thou art <u>cursed above all cattle</u>, and above every beast of the field; upon thy belly shalt thou go, and dust shalt thou eat all the days of thy life:

15 And <u>I will put enmity between thee and the woman</u>, and <u>between thy seed and her seed</u>; it shall bruise thy head, and thou shalt bruise his heel.

So Jesus took back the keys of death and hell and thus placed enmity between the woman's seed (this being Mary the mother of Jesus) and Satan's seed. Satan's seed being the children in Bondage of Sin, and the Woman's seed is the Free children that have obtained Salvation through the Woman's seed, that being Jesus Christ our Lord and Savior. This is how we became free of the Law of Sin and Death. However this is only if you walk in the Spirit.

This brings us to who the seed of Abraham is today. If you walk after the flesh, you are under the allegory of the bondage of sin. That representing Agar the handmaiden of Sara that was given to Abraham, of which represents Mount Sinai.

If you walk in the spirit, however, being born again, you are under the freewoman Sara who represents Jerusalem. If you live by the flesh, you are still under the bondage of sin, and thus the Law of Sin and Death, which is the soul that sins will surely die.

<u>allegory</u>: a story, poem, or picture which can be interpreted to reveal a hidden meaning.

At this time we will read through the scriptures so that we can fully understand the Law of Sin and Death and how it relates to every person that is not born again and

abstaining from turning back to sin. Notice I said born again and abstaining from sin. Both are required to not be under penalty of the Law of Sin and Death.

Gal 3:7-9

7 Know ye therefore <u>that they which are of faith</u>, the <u>same are the children of</u> <u>Abraham</u>.

So now we know that by faith in Jesus Christ, that we are the true seed of Abraham.

8 And the scripture, <u>foreseeing that God would justify the heathen through faith</u>, preached before the **gospel unto Abraham**, saying, <u>In thee shall all nations be</u> <u>blessed</u>.

9 So then they which be of <u>faith are blessed with faithful Abraham</u>.

So now we have learned that the Everlasting Gospel was preached unto Abraham.

10 For as many as <u>are of the works of the law are under the curse</u>: for it is written, Cursed is every one that continueth not in all things which are written in the book of the law to do them.

11 But that <u>no man is justified by the law</u> in the sight of God, it is evident: for, <u>The just shall live by faith</u>.

12 And the law is not of faith: but, The man that doeth them shall live in them.

13 <u>Christ hath redeemed us from the curse of the law</u>, being made a curse for us: for it is written, Cursed is every one that hangeth on a tree:

14 That the <u>blessing of Abraham might come on the Gentiles through Jesus Christ;</u> that <u>we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith</u>.

So the everlasting Gospel that was preached unto Abraham, was the faith of Jesus Christ that was to come through Abraham's seed, that we might receive the promise of the Spirit through faith, and thus inherit eternal life.

At this time I would like to turn your attention back to Genesis to the covenant that God made with Abram.

Gen 17:4-8 God said unto Abram

4 As for me, behold, <u>my covenant is with thee</u>, and thou shalt be a <u>father of many</u> <u>nations</u>.

5 Neither shall thy name any more be called Abram, but <u>thy name shall be</u> <u>Abraham</u>; for a <u>father of many nations</u> have I made thee.

6 And <u>I will make thee exceeding fruitful</u>, and <u>I will make nations of thee</u>, and kings shall come out of thee.

7 And <u>I will establish my covenant between me and thee and thy seed after thee</u> in their generations for an **everlasting covenant**, to be a God unto thee, and to **thy seed** after thee.

8 And <u>I will give unto thee</u>, and to **thy seed after thee**, <u>the land wherein thou art a</u> <u>stranger</u>, <u>all the land of Canaan</u>, for **an everlasting possession**; and **I will be their God**.

Gal 3:16-20

16 Now to Abraham and his **seed** were the promises made. He saith not, **And to seeds**, as of many; <u>but as of one</u>, And <u>to thy seed</u>, **which is Christ**.

17 And this I say, that the covenant, that was <u>confirmed before of God in Christ</u>, the law, which was four hundred and thirty years after, cannot disannul, that it should make the promise of none effect.

18 For if the <u>inheritance be of the law</u>, it is no more of promise: but God gave it to Abraham <u>by promise</u>.

19 Wherefore then serveth the law? It was added because of transgressions, <u>till the</u> <u>seed</u> should come to whom the promise was made; and it was ordained by angels in the hand of a mediator.

20 Now a mediator is not a mediator of one, but God is one.

Gal 3:22-29

22 But the scripture hath concluded <u>all under sin</u>, that the <u>promise by faith of Jesus</u> <u>Christ might be given to them that believe</u>.

23 But <u>before faith came</u>, we were kept under the law, shut up unto the faith which should afterwards be revealed.

24 Wherefore <u>the law was our schoolmaster to bring us unto Christ</u>, that we might be justified by faith.

25 But after that faith is come, we are no longer under a schoolmaster.

26 For ye are all the children of God by faith in Christ Jesus.

27 For as many of you as have been <u>baptized into Christ have put on Christ</u>.

28 There is neither Jew nor Greek, there is neither bond nor free, there is neither male nor female: for ye are all one in Christ Jesus.

29 And if ye be Christ's, <u>then are ye Abraham's seed</u>, and heirs according to the promise.

Romans 6:15-23

15 What then? shall we sin, because we are not under the law, but under grace? <u>God forbid</u>.

16 <u>Know ye not</u>, that <u>to whom ye yield yourselves servants to obey</u>, <u>his servants</u> <u>ye are to whom ye obey</u>; <u>whether</u> of <u>sin unto death</u>, **or** of <u>obedience unto</u> <u>righteousness</u>?

17 But God be thanked, that ye were the servants of sin, but ye have obeyed from the heart that form of doctrine which was delivered you.

18 Being then made free from sin, ye became the servants of righteousness.

19 I speak after the manner of men because of the infirmity of your flesh: for as ye have yielded your members servants to uncleanness and to iniquity unto iniquity; even so now yield your members servants to righteousness unto holiness.

20 For when ye were the servants of sin, ye were free from righteousness.

21 What fruit had ye then in those things whereof ye are now ashamed? for <u>the</u> <u>end of those things is death</u>.

22 But <u>now being made free from sin</u>, and become servants to God, ye have your <u>fruit unto holiness</u>, and <u>the end everlasting life</u>.

23 For the <u>wages of sin is death</u>; but the <u>gift of God is eternal life through Jesus</u> <u>Christ our Lord</u>.

Gal 4:1-7

4:1 Now I say, That the heir, as long as he is a child, differeth nothing from a servant, though he be lord of all;

2 But is under tutors and governors until the time appointed of the father.

3 Even so we, when we were children, were in bondage under the elements of the world:

4 But <u>when the fulness of the time was come</u>, God sent forth his Son, made of a <u>woman</u>, made <u>under the law</u>,

5 To redeem them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.

6 And because ye are sons, <u>God hath sent forth the Spirit of his Son into your hearts</u>, crying, Abba, Father.

7 Wherefore thou art no more a servant, but a son; and if a son, then an heir of God through Christ.

Now we see how we have obtained once again the Sonship to God that was lost when Adam and Eve sinned in the garden. We also see how we are circumcised of the heart by the Spirit and no longer by the Flesh, which was under the Mosaic Law.

Gal 4:22-31

22 For it is written, that Abraham had two sons, the <u>one by a bondmaid</u>, the <u>other</u> <u>by a freewoman</u>.

23 But he who was of the <u>bondwoman was born after the flesh</u>; but <u>he of the freewoman was by promise</u>.

24 Which things are an **allegory**: for these are the two covenants; the one from the mount Sinai, which gendereth to bondage, which is <u>Agar</u>.

25 For this Agar is mount Sinai in Arabia, and answereth to Jerusalem which now is, and is in bondage with her children.

26 But Jerusalem which is above is free, which is the mother of us all.

27 For it is written, Rejoice, thou barren that bearest not; break forth and cry, thou that travailest not: for the desolate hath many more children than she which hath an husband.

28 Now we, brethren, as Isaac was, are the children of promise.

29 But as then he that was born after the flesh persecuted him that was born after the Spirit, even so it is now.

30 Nevertheless what saith the scripture? <u>Cast out the bondwoman and her son</u>: for the son of the bondwoman shall not be heir with the son of the freewoman.

31 So then, brethren, we are not children of the bondwoman, but of the free.

To better understand if you are living under the works of the Flesh or the works of the Spirit let's read....

Gal 5:18-25 18 But <u>if ye be led of the Spirit, ye are not under the law</u>.

Here we were told if you be led by the Spirit you are not under the law. This tells me if you are not led by the Spirit, that you are under the law. This law, is the Law of Sin and Death. Which again is the soul that sins will surely die.

19 Now <u>the works of the flesh are manifest</u>, which are these; Adultery, fornication, uncleanness, lasciviousness,

20 Idolatry, witchcraft, hatred, variance, emulations, wrath, strife, seditions, heresies,

21 Envyings, murders, drunkenness, revellings, and such like: of the which I tell you before, as I have also told you in time past, that they which do such things shall not inherit the kingdom of God.

All of those were the works of the flesh. I suggest all that hear this, get a dictionary out and read what these words mean, and be sure that you are not doing one of these.

22 But the <u>fruit of the Spirit is love</u>, joy, peace, longsuffering, gentleness, goodness, faith,

- 23 Meekness, temperance: against such there is no law.
- 24 And they that are Christ's have crucified the flesh with the affections and lusts.
- 25 If we live in the Spirit, let us also walk in the Spirit.

John 8:33-34 Jesus is speaking with the jews.

33 They answered him, We be Abraham's seed, and were never in bondage to any man: how sayest thou, Ye shall be made free?

34 Jesus answered them, Verily, verily, I say unto you, <u>Whosoever committeth sin</u> is the servant of sin.

To better understand the atonement that God give to us.

Romans 5:10-21

10 For if, when we were enemies, <u>we were reconciled to God by the death of his</u> <u>Son</u>, much more, being reconciled, we shall be saved by his life.

11 And not only so, but we also joy in God through our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom we have now received the atonement.

12 Wherefore, as by <u>one man sin entered into the world</u>, and <u>death by sin</u>; and so <u>death passed upon all men</u>, <u>for that all have sinned</u>:

13 (For until the law sin was in the world: but sin is not imputed when there is no law.

14 Nevertheless death reigned from <u>Adam to Moses</u>, even over them that had not sinned after the similitude of Adam's transgression, <u>who is the figure of him that</u> <u>was to come</u>.

15 But not as the offence, so also is the free gift. For if through the offence of one many be dead, much more the grace of God, and the gift by grace, which is by one man, Jesus Christ, hath abounded unto many.

16 And not as it was by one that sinned, so is the gift: for the judgment was by one to condemnation, but the <u>free gift is of many offences unto justification</u>.

17 For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; <u>much more they which</u> receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by <u>one</u>, Jesus Christ.)

18 Therefore as by the offence of one judgment came upon all men to <u>condemnation</u>; even so by the <u>righteousness of one the free gift came upon all men</u> <u>unto justification of life</u>.

19 For as by <u>one man's disobedience many were made sinners</u>, so <u>by the</u> <u>obedience of one shall many be made righteous</u>.

20 Moreover <u>the law entered</u>, that the offence might abound. But where sin abounded, grace did much more abound:

21 <u>That as sin hath reigned unto death</u>, even so might grace reign through righteousness <u>unto eternal life by Jesus Christ our Lord</u>.

Romans 8:1-14

8:1 There is therefore now <u>no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus</u>, who walk <u>not after the flesh</u>, **but after the Spirit**.

2 For the <u>law of the Spirit</u> of life in Christ Jesus <u>hath made me free from the law</u> of sin and death.

3 For what the law could not do, in that it was weak through the flesh, God sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh, and for sin, <u>condemned sin in the flesh</u>:

4 That the righteousness of the law might be fulfilled in us, <u>who walk not after the</u> <u>flesh</u>, but <u>after the Spirit</u>.

5 For <u>they that are after the flesh do mind the things of the flesh</u>; but they that are after the <u>Spirit the things of the Spirit</u>.

6 For to be <u>carnally minded is death</u>; but to be <u>spiritually minded is life and peace</u>.

7 Because the <u>carnal mind is enmity against God</u>: for it is not subject to the law of God, neither indeed can be.

8 So then they that are in the flesh cannot please God.

9 But ye are not in the flesh, but <u>in the Spirit</u>, if <u>so be that the Spirit of God dwell</u> <u>in you</u>. Now if any man have not the Spirit of Christ, <u>he is none of his</u>.

10 And <u>if Christ be in you</u>, the <u>body is dead because of sin</u>; but the Spirit is life <u>because of righteousness</u>.

11 But if the Spirit of him that raised up Jesus from the dead dwell in you, he that raised up Christ from the dead <u>shall also quicken your mortal bodies by his Spirit</u> that dwelleth in you.

12 Therefore, brethren, we are debtors, not to the flesh, to live after the flesh.

13 For <u>if ye live after the flesh</u>, **ye shall die**: but <u>if ye through the Spirit do mortify</u> <u>the deeds of the body</u>, ye shall live.

14 For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.

I Cor 15:51-57

51 Behold, <u>I show you a mystery</u>; We shall not all sleep, but we shall all be changed,

52 In a moment, in the twinkling of an eye, <u>at the last trump</u>: for the trumpet shall sound, and the dead shall be raised incorruptible, and we shall be changed.

53 For this corruptible must put on incorruption, and this mortal must put on immortality.

54 So when this corruptible shall have put on incorruption, and this mortal shall have put on immortality, <u>then shall be brought to pass the saying that is written</u>, Death is swallowed up in victory.

55 **O death**, where is thy sting? **O grave**, where is thy victory?

56 The sting of death is sin; and the strength of sin is the law.

57 But thanks be to God, which giveth us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ.

The Mosaic Law of the Old Testament revealed to the people their sinfulness and their need for a Savior. It is this Mosaic Law that Christ Himself said that He did not come to abolish but to fulfill. This is an important point because some people get confused by thinking that keeping the Law saved people in the Old Testament, but the Bible is clear that salvation has always been by faith and the promise of salvation by faith through the seed of Abraham. That being Jesus Christ.

Hebrews 10:1-4

10:1 For the law having a shadow of good things to come, and not the very image of the things, can never with those sacrifices which they offered year by year continually make the comers thereunto perfect.

2 For then would they not have ceased to be offered? <u>because that the worshippers</u> once purged should have had no more conscience of sins.

3 But in those sacrifices there is a remembrance again made of sins every year.

4 For it is not possible that the blood of bulls and of goats should take away sins.

Hebrews 9:11-28

11 But <u>Christ being come an high priest of good things to come</u>, by a greater and more perfect tabernacle, not made with hands, that is to say, not of this building;
12 Neither by the blood of goats and calves, but <u>by his own blood he entered in once into the holy place</u>, having <u>obtained eternal redemption for us</u>.

13 For if the blood of bulls and of goats, and the ashes of an heifer sprinkling the unclean, <u>sanctifieth to the purifying of the flesh</u>:

14 <u>How much more shall the blood of Christ</u>, who through the eternal Spirit offered himself without spot to God, purge your conscience from dead works to serve the living God?

15 And for this cause he is the mediator of the new testament, that by means of death, for the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first testament, they which are called <u>might receive the promise of eternal inheritance</u>.

16 For where a testament is, <u>there must also of necessity be the death of the testator.</u>

17 For a <u>testament is of force after men are dead</u>: otherwise <u>it is of no strength at</u> <u>all while the testator liveth</u>.

18 Whereupon neither the first testament was dedicated without blood.

19 For when Moses had spoken every precept to all the people according to the law, he took the blood of calves and of goats, with water, and scarlet wool, and hyssop, and sprinkled both the book, and all the people,

20 Saying, This is the blood of the testament which God hath enjoined unto you.

21 Moreover he sprinkled with blood both the tabernacle, and all the vessels of the ministry.

22 And <u>almost all things are by the law purged with blood</u>; and <u>without shedding</u> <u>of blood is no remission</u>.

23 It was therefore necessary that the patterns of things in the heavens should be purified with these; but the heavenly things themselves with better sacrifices than these.

24 For Christ is not entered into the holy places made with hands, <u>which are the figures of the true</u>; but <u>into heaven itself</u>, <u>now to appear in the presence of God for us</u>:

25 Nor yet that he should offer himself often, as the high priest entereth into the holy place every year with blood of others;

26 For then must he often have suffered since the foundation of the world: but now once in the end of the world hath he appeared to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself.

27 And as <u>it is appointed unto men once to die</u>, but after this the judgment:
28 So Christ was <u>once offered to bear the sins of many</u>; and <u>unto them that look</u> for him shall he appear the second time without sin unto salvation.

So the Blessing of Abraham was on the gentiles through Jesus Christ, that we may receive the promise of the Spirit through faith. Fulfilled in Acts 2:38-39. Where as the Old Testament was through Faith and Sacrifices that they obtained the promise that was yet to come. Thus why Jesus went into Hell and preached unto them and took back the power that satan had over them, that being death and of hell.

## I Cor 15:24-26

24 Then cometh the end, when he shall have delivered up the kingdom to God, even the Father; when he shall have put down all rule and all authority and power.25 For he must reign, till he hath put all enemies under his feet.

26 The last enemy that shall be destroyed is death.

In closing,

All that live under the Flesh and the Law of Sin and Death will take part in the second death of the great white throne judgment and will be cast into the Lake of Fire and Brimstone.

So then,

II Peter 2:4-9

4 {For} if <u>God spared not the angels that sinned</u>, but <u>cast them down to hell</u>, and <u>delivered them into chains of darkness</u>, to be <u>reserved unto judgment</u>;

5 And <u>spared not the old world</u>, but saved Noah the eighth person, a preacher of righteousness, bringing in the flood upon the world of the ungodly;

6 And <u>turning the cities of Sodom and Gomorrha into ashes</u> condemned them with an overthrow, making them an ensample unto those that after should live ungodly;

7 And <u>delivered just Lot</u>, <u>vexed with the filthy conversation of the wicked</u>:

8 (For that righteous man dwelling among them, in seeing and hearing, vexed his righteous soul from day to day with their unlawful deeds;)

9 The Lord knoweth how to deliver the godly out of temptations, and to reserve the unjust unto the day of judgment to be punished:

Jude 1:6-8

6 And the <u>angels which kept not their first estate</u>, but left their own habitation, <u>he</u> <u>hath reserved in everlasting chains under darkness unto the judgment of the great</u> <u>day</u>.

7 Even as <u>Sodom and Gomorrha</u>, and the cities about them in like manner, giving themselves <u>over to fornication</u>, and <u>going after strange flesh</u>, are set forth for an example, <u>suffering the vengeance of eternal fire</u>.

8 <u>Likewise also these filthy dreamers defile the flesh</u>, despise dominion, and speak evil of dignities.
